Briefs from Brent

In John 7 we find Jesus at the Feast of Booths. During this festival the people would temporarily live in temporary shelters and they would remember God's faithfulness during Israel's wilderness wanderings. There were two very important symbols that were prominent during this time of feasting. One of those symbols was water. On each of the seven days prior to the final day of the feast, the priests drew water from the Pool of Siloam and then carried a golden pitcher full of water to the Temple and then around the altar. When the priests neared the water gate a horn was blown and the people began to sing psalms of praise to God for the blessing of the harvest. The people understood that rain was important if they were to have a good harvest and they were aware that they needed full cisterns after the dryness of summer.

Perhaps the people remembered the Exodus story when Moses struck the rock and water flowed from the rock. God had saved them from dying in the desert from dehydration. On the last day of the feast which was known as the greatest day, there was not a water ceremony reminding them of God's provision. But this year Jesus came to that place on the last day of the festival. It was customary for teachers to sit and teach but Jesus stood up and with a loud voice cried out "if anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. The one who believes in me, as the scripture has said, will have streams of living water flow from deep within him." (John 7:37b-38 ESV). Perhaps, over time, the last day of the festival had lost some of its spiritual focus and luster and it had become just a festival whose purpose had been replaced with just fun. If so, Jesus, single handedly broke that tradition and pointed the people once again to the need for water and their need for the God who provided water. Water to drink was available at the festival and probably was not in short supply. But Jesus was approaching thirst from a spiritual view point and he knew that the crowd was spiritually thirsty. He points to himself declaring that he could quench that thirst if they would have faith in him. If our point of reference is the Exodus text Jesus was saying "I am that rock from which waters flow. Your situation may look desperate but if you put your faith in me you benefit from the streams of living water that flow from deep within me." Furthermore, Jesus was promising them that by faith, streams of refreshing, living water could flow from deep within their souls. Jesus was talking about the Spirit that all who believed in Him were going to receive. When we believe in Jesus, spiritually we will never thirst again. When streams of living water flow from deep with us, we can share a cup of water with someone else.

Wayne City




