
Briefs from Brent

Making a trip to Jerusalem at the festive time of the Passover would have been a trip to look forward to. If Jesus had said "he must go to Jerusalem" the disciples would have said "let's go." But what Jesus said was "I must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised" (Matthew 16:21 ESV). Jesus knew why he had been sent to earth and he knew that the time for fulfilling that purpose was at hand. He was going to suffer because of the accusations of vile leaders and he was going to die at the hands of brutal men. Even though there was going to be a resurrection the process was going to be painful. If you understood this it would take all the fun out of going to Jerusalem. Peter did not grasp nearly all the meaning of what Jesus said but he understood enough of it that he rebuked Jesus for saying it. Jesus said "he must" and Peter argued "you don't have to." Peter took Jesus aside and mildly rebuked him "this is not going to happen to you. You are going to scare the guys with this kind of talk" (paraphrase mine). Jesus turned to Peter with a harsh rebuke "Get behind me Satan! You are a hindrance to me. For you are not setting your mind on the things of God but on the things of man" (Matthew 16:23 ESV).

I think we should periodically ask ourselves "am I being a hindrance to Jesus?" Then we should listen for the Lord's answer. If we are not careful, even with our good intentions, we can be a hindrance to Jesus.

We become a hindrance to Jesus when our pre-conceived notions blind us to the plans of God. Peter was excited and serious about following Jesus. Peter believed that Jesus was the answer but Peter did not know what the answer was. His nationalistic ideas regarding the faith did not allow him to understand the real purpose for which Jesus had come.

Peter was a strategic thinker. But his strategy was not informed by spiritual directions. Eventually, Peter's strategic mind would be molded by spiritual renewal and understanding and he would become a valuable missionary for the church. But at this moment he was being a hindrance to Jesus and Jesus let him know it. We need pragmatic thinking in order to do the work of the church. But if our pragmatism overrules the spiritual mandates from the Lord, we are being a hindrance to Jesus.

Those Who Have Gone Before Us




A few months ago, I was in the "old" fellowship hall in the basement of Liberty Baptist Church and discovered a piece of information about a Mary Phillips who had served as a missionary to China. Thanks to the help of Nola Jones and Debbie Collins I have been able to secure more information about Mary. Mary was a charter member of Liberty Baptist Church in Burnt Prairie. She became a school teacher and had taken a job teaching in Aurora, Illinois. While there, Brother R.C. Daily pointed out to her that places like Aurora find it easy to get teachers but that it was much more difficult for the Lord to get workers to teach His word and propagate His ways. Through Brother Daily's encouragement and through the prayers of her church Mary made the decision to dedicate her services to the Lord.



Mary was granted a scholarship to the W.M.U. Training School in Louisville, KY to prepare herself for missionary work. She studied there for three years.

In August of 1923, one-hundred years ago last month, she set sail from Seattle, Washington on the President McKinley for the land of China. The field was wide open for missionary work in China at that time. In fact, that year marked the largest number of missionaries being sent out to China. Mary served a great deal of her time in Chinkiang, China. Mary served in China for something over six years when she returned to the United States and married Harry King in November of 1930 in San Francisco. In California Mary remained active in church work, resumed her teaching career, and retired from teaching in 1965. Mary and her husband had one daughter. Mary Phillips went before us and was found faithful. May we who come behind her be found faithful.

Two from FBC Fairfield Serve on Mission Team

Pat Scarbrough and Tammy Estes of First Baptist Fairfield served on the mission field in Araraquara, Sao Paulo, Brazil from July 21-30th with the Joni and Friends Wheels for the World. The mission was to distribute wheelchairs and mobility aids for those who needed them. Each person that attended the distribution outreach heard the Gospel and each family received a Bible in Portuguese as well as a book on the life of Joni Erikson Tada. The outreach distributed 128 wheelchairs and another 16 walkers, canes, and crutches. A total of 351 people heard the Gospel and 93 responded in faith and repentance. The mission team was made of 10 volunteers from the United States along with a Brazilian team leader that worked alongside 47 volunteers from the local church in Araraquara.

Pat and Tammy are thankful for the support of GWBA through the daily prayer updates as well as the mission scholarship fund that helped financially support the trip.


