Briefs from Brent

The poet said, "careful with fire is good advice we know, careful with words is ten times doubly so." Perhaps this poet was a student of the Bible. Paul wrote "Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person" (Col. 4:6). Both the poet and Paul knew that words were hard to retract once they have been spoken. Words live on in the minds of the persons who hear them. That means we want to be sure that what we say is what we want to say, and even more so what we should say. Some people are proud of speaking what is on their minds, but if that be true, we need to be sure that what is on our minds is wholesome and pure and correct. What we speak should not just be an opinion or a preference but should reflect the mind and soul of God. As a believer in Christ our words should be bathed in the heart and truth of the gospel. For we have not been assigned the task of propagating the thoughts and ways of this world, but we have been entrusted to proclaim the eternal hope of salvation found in the Lord Jesus.

In I Thessalonians 2:4 Paul said, "But just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel, so we speak, not to please man, but to please God who tests our hearts." Communicating the truth of the gospel, the good news of God to men is not always, maybe not even usually, well received. The gospel message is not a belligerent message, but it is sometimes received with belligerence. The truth is we sometimes present the gospel with belligerent tones. We should speak carefully in order not to do that. Yet at the same time we should present the gospel not just as a good idea but as the truth of God. The truth may not be pleasing to the ears of men, but it is the truth. The gospel story may not concur with their world view, but it is the truth. The gospel might confound their minds and trouble their hearts, but we do not speak to please man, we speak to please God. Our listeners may wish to argue and question the truth that we speak. But we are called to endure and not compromise truth in the interest of placating the listener. The disciples of this world may wish to test our hearts. But we should recall and firmly plant this thought in our mind, God is the one wrote the test and he is the who will tests our hearts. If we are going to pass the test, we must speak not to please man, but to please God.

Upcoming GWBA Annual Meeting

On Sunday Sept. 15th, Crossville Missionary Baptist Church will host the Annual Meeting of the Greater Wabash Baptist Association. The meeting will begin at 3:30 PM, We will break for a meal at 5:00 PM and then reconvene at 6:00 and rejoice together in a time of worship. We are honored this year to have Dr. Nate Adams, the Executive Director of the Illinois Baptist State Association with us for this event. Dr. Adams will be preaching to us during the evening service.

Sale of the Associational Parsonage

The Association has sold the parsonage. The property sold for \$135,000. After the realtor's commission and closing cost, we had a net amount of \$125,363.25. Our resource team met and discussed how to invest this money. After much discussion they decided to allocate the money as follows:

\$30,000 in a 6-month CD with People's Bank at 5% interest allowing the interest to compound.

\$30,000 in a 12-month CD with People's Bank at 5% interest allowing the interest to compound.

\$30,000 in a 3-year bond with the Baptist Foundation of Illinois at interest rate of 5% with interest being paid every 6 months.

\$30,000 in a 5-year bond with the Baptist Foundation of Illinois at interest rate of 5% with interest being paid every 6 months.

The balance, \$5,363.25 invested in a cash management account with the Baptist Foundation of Illinois at the interest rate of 2.5%.


